You will also find explanations for the Kickstarter Exclusives, Backer Inspired Cards, and Time Travelers on the reference cards.



Recommendations:

Super Tooth is extremely flexible. You can modify your deck to include the perfect combination of exclusives and expansions to suit the ages and experience of the players. We recommend that you play your first game with just the 62 card base deck to familiarize yourself with the game play. It should only take a couple of plays to get comfortable with Super Tooth. Then read about the exclusives/expansions before adding them to the deck.

The ability of most exclusives and events should be easy to remember after a couple of plays, but it is always handy to have the reference cards nearby. The exception to this would be the Time Travelers whose abilities are more complex than the Event and Exclusive cards.
